#### **New Internship Opportunities**

This semester's class of Roxbury Youth Programs (RYP) is 34 young people strong - the largest in the program's recent history. Four of these students will be working as Career Exploration Interns with UUUM's Development and Community Engagement departments.

Our Career Exploration Interns will learn skills they can take with them, and share what they learn with younger RYP students. They will create videos, craft blog posts and amplify our social media. We are happy to have them as part of the team!

#### **Learning Through Artistic Expression**

RYP gives young people an opportunity for artistic expression. Each week, they participate in workshops where they use art to open up important conversations. In the coming weeks, local artists will share various artistic disciplines with RYP students.



David retired as Managing Director of the Charles Hamilton Houston Institute for Race and Justice and lecturer at Harvard Law School. David has extensive experience in many facets of civil rights issues.

Prior to his position at the Charles Hamilton Houston Institute he served as founding Executive Director of the Fair Housing Center of Greater Boston. David is the former President of the Board of Directors of the Massachusetts Foundation for the Humanities and longtime chair of the Medford Human Rights commission. He currently chairs the Massachusetts Advisory Committee to the U.S. Commission on Civil Rights. He served for many years on the board of the UU Urban Ministry.


