Roxbury Youth Programs (RYP)

This year, RYP students are producing a play that examines social justice issues from their perspectives. They are working with RYP's Community Teaching Artist, Naheem Garcia, a Roxbury native who brings a wealth of knowledge in theater and acting.

Additionally this past month, RYP students had workshops that looked at the creation of podcasts, and they worked with a local artist to create a mural on a wall near the peace garden.

Did You Know?


Paul Revere wasn't alone riding to warn the British were coming



Longfellow's poem "Paul Revere's Ride" immortalized that 1775 trek on horseback to warn those in Lexington and Concord that British soldiers were marching in their direction. But Revere wasn't the only person to do so.

William Dawes Jr. was an American soldier, and was one of several men who, in April 1775, alerted minutemen in Massachusetts of the approach of British regulars prior to the battles of Lexington and Concord at the outset of the American Revolution. **And his ride started from First Church in Roxbury.**
