As evenings come earlier, and summer wanes, we thank you for sustaining our work in the midst of challenging times. Your gifts make a difference.



Preparing for After High School

In our RYP summer program, we want young people to see a fuller landscape of their options. So in addition to college visits to Roxbury Community College, Benjamin Franklin Cummings Institute of Technology and Framingham State University, last week we convened a trades panel. Tradespeople including an electrician from D's Electric, fire system installation manager from Keyes North Atlantic, and an architect from DREAM Collaborative who works with many trades, gathered to tell young people what their work is like. And they had nearby examples - all of them had contributed to the Meetinghouse restoration!

UUUM Career Exploration Internship





Reflecting on Local Legacies


This summer, young people took visitors on tours of the neighborhood they'd created thanks to a grant from Mass Humanities and mentoring from Live Like a Local Tours founder Collin Knight. Over several months last school year, 5 students crafted a tour that included our Meetinghouse, the Roxbury Heritage State Park, and their own John D. O'Bryant School of Mathematics and Science. Then they led the tours for visitors through the summer. The guides

connected the historic landmarks to their own lived experience - and how they see themselves in the stories of their neighborhood.

Black and Indigenous Legacies at First Church in Roxbury

The UU Urban Ministry, in partnership with the Roxbury Historical Society, invites you to a public presentation on our new report into the history of enslavement at First Church Roxbury.

For the past year, through a grant from the Harvard Reparative Partnership program, two graduate students advanced the work UUUM and RHS began several years ago. The student researchers were MIT Master of City Planning student Mica Caine and Boston University American Studies doctoral student Mary Snyder.

Mary's research advanced the foundational work by Harvard doctoral

student Aabid Allibhai, Race & Slavery at the First Church in Roxbury published in 2023. Mica's focus was on tracing history in the opposite direction – from present to past – by engaging young people in history - their own history, and tracing and sharing history.

We're proud to recognize Cindy Soule from First Parish in Concord as our Volunteer of the Month.




