

#### **Message from Our Executive Director and Senior Minister**



This month, historian Thomas Plant stood beneath the ailing red maple tree not far from the Meetinghouse steps, and honored its life.

For 100 or 150 years, he calculated, the tree had fed the birds and shaded jazz concertgoers on our greenspace, and provided climbing places for squirrels.

A small gathering of neighbors stood near, beneath cloudy skies and the chance of rain, listening.

The tree, dying slowly, had begun dropping branches and needed to be cut down. But first, Thomas - an historian and public health advocate and member of the Urban Ministry board - honored its life.

It was a small thing, maybe - taking time to honor the life of a tree when daily we are assailed by bad news: broad assaults on the earth and so many people. But somehow, it mattered.


In upside-down times, we ground ourselves in the sacred and the holy around us. We build friendships. We strengthen community.

The students of Roxbury Youth Programs (RYP), our afterschool program, have had a full schedule as the year comes to a close.

Recently, the students were visited by Bob Glover, a Boston-area videographer, who led a workshop on video-making and storytelling. He plans to return in September to help students create videos they can submit as part of their college applications.

RYP also welcomed Georgia Foote, a realtor and member of the Weston congregation, who gave students an inside look at the world of real estate. She walked them through the process of getting a real estate license, what the job entails, and the types of real estate



careers available. Georgia also guided students through the steps of buying a home and shared insight on what to look for when house-hunting in the future.



The youth also had the opportunity to participate in a woodworking class led by volunteer, Phil Nowers, a woodworker and member of Theodore Parker Church. The students learned how to measure, cut, and assemble pieces of wood to build their own trays or picture frames.

The UU Urban Ministry is committed to spotlighting the work of Black an Brown artists from Roxbury and Boston-area. A few months back, we welcomed Dayenne Walters to our team in the role of arts liaison.

Dayenne is a longtime Boston resident, where she has lived for over 30 years, just around the corner from the Unitarian Universalist Urban Ministry campus. She is a creative professional with a background in both the visual and performing arts. She holds a BFA in Studio Arts from the School of the Museum of Fine Arts and a certificate in Graphic Design/Marketing Communications from MassArt.

In her role, Dayenne focuses on building partnerships with arts and cultural institutions in Roxbury, with a commitment to social justice and supporting artists of color.

For those of you who have taken our "Public Art In and Near Nubian Square" walking tour, Dayenne is a familiar face. As arts liaison, she is identifying ways UUUM can work with local artists, community institutions, and member congregations to support and highlight local artists.

This is more than a history lesson - it is a chance to engage, reflect, and learn to take action. Participants will:


- Explore the rich and real history of Roxbury, the First Church in Roxbury, and the role the UU Urban Ministry has played in the community



# **Celebrating Roxbury Patriots' Day**




Rev. Mary Margaret Earl and historian Thomas Plant speaking to the crowd gathered in Putnam Hall during Roxbury Patriots' Day


The Roxbury Branch of the Boston Public Library is a great resource for the neighborhood. In addition to books and information, they have a full schedule of community events, including:


