Message from Our Executive Director and Senior Minister



Tomorrow, April 18, if you slow down, breathe and listen, you might hear the sound of bells ringing.

Church bells across the country will ring in recognition of the American Revolution, and the fight for liberty.

They will ring in Roxbury, too, from Boston's oldest wood frame church building; our Meetinghouse.

They will ring in John Eliot Square - the place from which John Dawes rode a ride parallel to Paul Revere's to warn that the British were coming. They will ring above the greenspace where the Patriot troops gathered and performed military drills. They will ring across from the parsonage that once housed First Church Roxbury's minister, taken over by a Patriot general to plan for the war.

This history in Roxbury - often overlooked - will be lifted up again by Roxbury community members - the Roxbury Collaborative - on Patriot's Day Monday when Dawe's ride is reenacted in front of our restored Meetinghouse steps. So, too, they will lift up the history of African Americans veterans in the presentation by military veteran Mary-dith Tuitt: *They Fought for Our Freedom and Democracy: Blacks in the Military 1700 - Present.*

For decades, the Collaborative has persistently celebrated the contributions of African American veterans, and the key role of Roxbury in the Revolution. They have pressed forward to highlight African American history that has been broadly ignored and overlooked. And they have, over and over, succeeded.

Tomorrow, the Meetinghouse bells will call us to honor faithfulness to that history.

And they will call us to be inspired by that struggle to live into our highest ideals today.


And they will call us to imagine what future we want to build, together.

Program Updates

Roxbury Youth Programs (RYP)

This month at RYP, our young people have been learning what it means to make a difference in their own communities.

Students participated in an interactive workshop called "Rise Above Redlining". The workshop used the power of art and community dialogue to reflect on the past, confront present challenges, and reimagine a future of educational equality and cultural richness. This workshop was facilitated by local community activists Dart Adams and Marlon Solomon.

Also this month, students also had the special opportunity to meet Massachusetts Appeals Court Judge Vickie Henry, who spoke with them about her legal journey and encouraged the students to participate in civic engagement.

As part of their learning, students visited the National Center for Afro-American Artists, where Barry Gaither led a tour exploring the history and impact of African-American and African diasporan art.

The average stay for a resident at Renewal House, our emergency domestic violence shelter, is often measured in years - not weeks.

This month, we celebrate a Renewal House resident finding permanent housing. This is always a major accomplishment - especially now in the face of a brutal housing market that means affordable rentals are scarce. Thanks to our supporters - we were able to help this family secure furniture and other necessities as they take this next step.

Renewal House is financed in large part by government funding. We continue to monitor the current political situation to ensure there is no interruption in our ability to do this life-changing work with survivors. We are grateful to supporters like you who are committed to making this work possible.






Join artists Amanda Ugorji and Sophie Weston Chien for an intimate and thought-provoking




